I. GENERAL CLARIFICATIONS:

- A. Addendum No. 1, General Clarifications, Item C shall be revised to read:
Contractor shall coordinate with Berkshire Systems for all fire alarm system related issues. 1-800-344-4012. Pricing for any work required by Berkshire Systems to ensure compliance with L&I requirements shall be included within the Bidder's quote.
- B. Contractor shall replace existing elevator main line disconnects with new fusible, lockable disconnects. In addition, Contractor shall provide new fusible, lockable disconnects at the bottom landing of the elevator room, in close proximity to the elevator room door. Contractor shall ensure new disconnects meet requirements for working space in front of new disconnects per code. Tie new disconnects to existing newly replaced disconnects. All work shall be in accordance to L&I and NEC requirements.
- C. As a clarification, painted surfaces for the elevator machine room and pit painting is called out in the elevator specification Page 8 of 9, paragraph 2.24.
- D. As a part of replacing the elevator car ceiling, include fan replacement.
- E. As a clarification, Section 14250, Paragraph 2.23 - Top of Car Inspection, the Contractor shall include any required railings per code.
- F. Section 14250 - Section 1.9, add Paragraph M. Contractor shall ensure existing elevator pit meets code for lighting, GFI outlets, etc.

I. GENERAL CLARIFICATIONS:

- B. Refer to attached revised Prevailing Wage Rate Determination (13 pages).
- C. Contractor shall coordinate with Berkshire Systems for all fire alarm system related issues. 1-800-344-4012.
- D. An RFI was received by L&K Construction asking the following:
 - Q: Please clarify what type of paint system should be used on the elevator floor for the above mentioned bid.
 - A: The flooring paint system shall be H&C Low VOC sealer, clear gloss solvent based sealer. Two coats minimum.
- E. An RFI was received by Otis Elevator asking the following:
 - Q: We would like to use the Elevonic R series system for this project.
 - A: Thank you for your responses. However, I still need some clarification. Please note that my intentions here are for our Client (SCHA) to get the best possible product that will be around for a long time and function reliably. In addition, I desire that their operating costs, not just for utilities but also for maintenance, are low and reasonable.

For matters of speedy maintenance (minimal downtime) and parts replacement, all parts need to be non-proprietary / open-architecture and built in the USA. If all the equipment is part of a System then in the future you cannot replace just the buttons, or the door equipment or the leveling system without replacing everything. By using independent vendors they all must be compatible with each other and use an open architecture, USA made equipment. If such is the case with your equipment, then I foresee no problem.

With respect to Otis controls may or may not be made in the US by the time of order. I do not want to be the first one off the new line nor one made over seas (for reasons stated previously).

I feel Otis has to capability to bid this project competitively with the specs currently in place. The questions and concerns we have raised will be the same concerns that we will be looking for during our shop drawing review and will hold any elevator contractor to the same standards. Otis does not have to bid the project with cheaper equipment (manufactured overseas) to be competitive.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:
